Commodore's Report



I know that some members have expressed concerns about recent changes to our staff. I have addressed many of these members directly and I am more than willing to discuss these changes in person with members.

Please understand that we have more than 650 members of the Club now and as Commodore, I am committed to serving every member and the Club as a whole. As a Board, we have had to make difficult decisions, but we do so by keeping in mind that every member is important and that our goal is to ensure the future of the Club.

Last week we had to limit our hours of service due to a shortage in staff. Miranda, our Kitchen Manager, resigned and Tracy, our Assistant Bar Manager, was terminated. Like many members, I love all of our staff and I miss a great amount of our former staff. This Club relies on our staff to run day-to-day operations of the Club. To do that successfully and to ensure that member service stays at the forefront of our staff's mission, we need a team that is willing to adapt and willing to work together. In the wake of some significant changes to our staff earlier this year, the Board has laid out a clear structure for our staff and has set clear expectations for our team. Some difficult decisions

have been made, but I believe that we now have a team that is willing to work together and that each employee meets the expectations of our membership.

As part of the structure that we have implemented, The Board has appointed Gina Welch, our former office manager, as Interim General Manager. Ryleigh has remained as our Front of House Manager, and Bobby has returned to his former position of Kitchen Manager. Gina and Ryleigh have picked up all of the duties of our former GM and with the assistance of myself and the Board, we are running the day-to-day operations of the Club. We are recruiting additional kitchen staff, bar staff, and Summer operations staff (lifeguards, etc.) to prepare for a busy Summer. We will place Team Leads in each department to ensure consistency of service and to assist with management. We are setting up a Search Committee to seek out a permanent General Manager, but my opinion is that this team has done some incredible work and that they are capable of exceeding member expectations. It is also my opinion, however, that the decision over a permanent General Manager should not be up to me. I intend to keep the membership informed of the Search Committee's progress and to put the recommendation of the Search Committee to a vote for our General Membership.

On May 12, we will hold a town hall meeting at the Club so that I may provide additional details on these developments and so that the Membership can weigh in on future projects of the Club and the use of the money we raised from the Drawdown. I want to make it clear to our members that this Club belongs to all of us. Just like our staff, we can



accomplish much more as a team who works together than as a group of individuals working in different directions. While this Club belongs to you as a member, this Club belongs to each of the other 650+ members. To make this place better for everyone, sometimes you will be called to set aside your personal goals and desires to better serve others. To me, this is what part of being a Club is all about.

Our next very popular event is the annual Kentucky Derby Party, held on Race Day with the customary



Boat and kayak use at the Club is increasing with the warmer weather. As a reminder, if you take a boat out that is owned by our Sailing Squadron or by the Club, whether it is a Hobie, a kayak, or any thing else in between, you must wear a lifejacket. No exceptions. This is especially critical to comply with state laws. When boating in Mississippi, anyone12 years of age and younger must wear a Type I, II or III U.S. Coast Guard-approved personal floatation device (PFD), and you are required to have at least one U.S. Coast Guard-approved Type I, II, III, or V PFD for each person on board, regardless of the length of vesse, or the age of persons. This includes canoes or kayaks.


A Tribute to 2024 Commodore
