### Commodore's Report



#### Ahoy!

I hope that everyone enjoyed Memorial Day and that you and your family took time to reflect on the solemn nature of the holiday and on the blessings that we enjoy due to the sacrifices made by the men and women of our armed forces. As

you know Memorial Day marks the beginning of our Summer season and the Club has been busier than ever. Our staff is working hard to accommodate all of our members and guests, but please understand that the Club is sometimes overwhelmed by a large number of members and guests and that service may be affected at times. We are working to streamline things by using our downstairs bar and outdoor kitchen during peak demand hours, but your patience is greatly appreciated until we can implement these changes and bring our new staff members up to speed. I want to personally apologize for any issues that members encountered this past weekend or previously and I want you to know that I have been talking through these concerns with our members and our staff to ensure that we learn from any mistakes and implement meaningful changes to better serve our members and guests.

Our management has sent a number of emails to the membership regarding unsupervised children in the pool and in the clubhouse. Some of these issues still persist and if we continue having issues with children, the members responsible for those children may face penalties including suspension of pool privileges and clubhouse access. We are monitoring this situation closely, but the bottom line is this: if you are a parent, you are responsible for your children. Our staff needs to focus on serving the membership and should not be required to interrupt that mission to police children. Our lifeguards and our bartenders are not babysitters and other members should not have to tell your children how to follow the rules.

Please review the House Rules and if you are a parent, please make sure that your children understand these rules. The House Rules are available on our website under the "Info for Members" tab. One of the biggest issues I have seen lately are members and children entering the clubhouse with wet swimsuits. This creates a safety issue as other people may slip on water left behind. Additionally, as I have discussed previously, there is another concern with abuse of club property by unsupervised children. Kayaks have been left out on the beach too many times and it has become a burden on the Club instead of another amenity.

On another note, we held a town hall meeting earlier this month to discuss the use of the Drawdown Proceeds and some other issues facing the Club. I was encouraged by most of the discussion but I would have liked to get more feedback from newer and younger members. While I understand that it can be intimidating to some newer people who want to get involved in the Club, this is your Club too and we want to hear from you on how we can improve things.

The fortieth annual Slip to Ship Regatta is in the books, with Duly Chaltain and his crew as repeat winners in the race around Deer Island. The other really big win of note was in

the Nacra 20' class for son and father team Robbie and Jay Shuman - their first ever first place in their catamaran class.

Twenty-four boats were on the water for two days of distance racing. Day One featured a race from OSYC to the east end of Ship Island for lunch, followed by a race along the same course from the island back to the Club. Day Two was clockwise race around Deer Island with both the start and finish on the waters just off the Club's beach. Thanks go out to Dr. David McClendon and his medical group for providing breakfast on Day Two of Slip to Ship.

the 2025 sail camps started off with 16 experienced junior sailors in the first Adventure Camp of the summer. Informal racing (usually a steeplechase) is taking place on Wednesday evenings, weather permitting, and Friday Night Races will be starting soon as slightly more formal racing for bragging rights and fun this year at the OSYC!

Boat and kayak use at the Club is increasing with the warmer weather. As a reminder, if you take a boat out that is owned by our Sailing Squadron or by the Club, you must wear a lifejacket. This is especially critical to comply with state laws. As has been mentioned before, when boating in Mississippi, **anyone12 years of age and younger must wear a Type I, II or III U.S. Coast Guardapproved personal floatation device (PFD)**, and you are required to have at least one U.S. Coast Guard-approved Type I, II, III, or V PFD for each person on board, regardless of the length of vessel. This includes canoes or kayaks. The remaining 2025 Club regatta schedule is as follows:

### Farewell to the Kayaks



Three of the Club kayaks, paddles, and lifejackets were left abandoned on the beach on Memorial Day, and were discovered by our Club staff and management on Tuesday morning in the surf zone. One of the three kayaks was completely filled with water and is no longer useable.

Unfortunately, this is not an isolated incident. On a weekly basis, if not more frequently, staff and a few of our members are finding Club kayaks left out on the beach, and also paddles and life jackets. Not wearing a life jacket when taking out a kayak is also continuing despite warnings.

Due to the ongoing nature of this problem, and to continued use and abuse of the Club kayaks by some of our younger members without life jackets, we are no longer providing them for member use. The four kayaks and paddles will be secured, and only brought out for use by sailing camp attendees.

We assure you all that we have hired some new staff to help us during our busiest time of the year and we are working hard to get them trained and ready to provide a great experience for you all!
